IRWA Course 402: Introduction to the Income Capitalization Approach

Date: April 17, 2013 Location: MOA Public Works, Permit & Development Center (4700 Elmore Rd.)

Facilitator: Norman H. Lee Coordinator: Kathryn Schreckenghost (907-646-5169; katsch@drydenlarue.com)

Course Description: This course introduces the income capitalization approach, which is a method of evaluating an investment by estimating future cash flows and taking into consideration the time value of money. This approach is presented in a concise, easy-to-understand format, and combines lecture, case studies and exercises to teach participants how to apply income capitalization in a variety of situations. Topics include the relationship between the Valuation Process and the Income Capitalization Approach, the applicability and reliability of the approach, the characteristics of Direct and Yield Capitalization, the components of Direct Capitalization (determining gross income, estimating vacancy and credit loss, calculating effective gross income, estimating expense, and estimating value), Capitalization Rate Development, and determining Just Compensation.

IRWA Course 403: Easement Valuation

Date: April 18, 2013 Location: MOA Public Works, Permit & Development Center (4700 Elmore Rd.)

Facilitator: Norman H. Lee Coordinator: David Williams (907-646-5168; dewilliams@drydenlarue.com)

Course Description: This course is taught as a practical, hands-on course. Participants will learn specific methods and procedures to measure and value property before and after an encumbrance, as well as damages, if any result. Topics include the nature of easements, bundle of rights, easements vs. licenses en gross vs. appurtenant, creation/duration, residuals, and reversionary interests; the two approaches to valuation: Before and After (Federal Rule) and Value of part taken plus damages (State Rule); steps in the appraisal process (State Rule): how to value the whole larger parcel, when the taking is typical of the whole, when the taking is not typical of the whole, how to value the part taken, use of paired sales, the three R's; damages, severance, cost-to-cure, change in highest and best use, increased cost of operation, restraints upon future development; how to value temporary easements; and appraisal of special easements (scenic, slope, flood, flowage, air rights, others).

IRWA Course 431: Problems in the Valuation of Partial Acquisitions (NEW COURSE!)

Date: April 19, 2013 Location: MOA Public Works, Permit & Development Center (4700 Elmore Rd.)

Facilitator: Norman H. Lee Coordinator: Vicki Gerken (907-343-8187; gerkenvl@muni.org)

Course Description: This course presents more complex partial acquisition valuation problems and offers opportunities for the participants to understand better the possible applications of appraisal theory to specific partial acquisition appraisal situations. Topics include Before Acquisition Valuation; Highest and Best Use as assemblage with adjoining owner; After Acquisition Value; Benefits; USPAP and The Uniform Act; Larger Parcel; Consistent Use and Interim Use; Comparable Sales; Zoning; Cost to Cures; and Profits a Prendre and the Unit Rule.

IRWA Course 902: Property Descriptions

Date: April 26, 2013 Location: MOA Public Works, Permit & Development Center (4700 Elmore Rd.)

Facilitator: John F. Bennett Coordinator: Sandra Dooley (907-562-2000; sdooley@dowlhkm.com)

Course Description: This course covers topographic and property information on engineering plans, the interrelationship of plan, profile, and cross-section views, the horizontal and vertical alignment of a centerline, aerial photogrammetry, place coordinates, utility line crossings of highways, contours, calculating earthwork, and the interpretation of right of way plans. Topics include requirements of a valid description; use of the rectangular grid system; when and how to use the point and centerline method; sources of uncertainties; subdivision descriptions; and metes and bounds descriptions.

ACCESS LAW SEMINAR HELD ON FEBRUARY 22

118 people attended Chapter 49's seminar "Access Law and Issues Affecting Public and Private Lands in Alaska" on February 22 at the Dena'ina Center.

The speakers were (from left to right in picture to the right) Dan Beardsley, SR/WA, Right of Way Manager for Dryden & LaRue, Inc.; Rick Elliot, SR/WA, a private land management con-

sultant; and John F. Bennett, PLS, SR/WA, Right of Way Chief for DOTPF Northern Region.

The major topics of discussion were RS 2477 Rights of Way, Public Land Orders and Other Highway Rights of Way, Alaska Native Claim Settlement Act 17(b) Easements, Alaska Supreme Court Cases on Easements, and Public Prescriptive Easements.

Thank you to Mr. Beardsley, Mr. Bennett, and Mr. Elliot for giving the attendees a great opportunity to hear discussion of issues that commonly need to be dealt with on right of way projects, and thanks also to Vicki Gerken for taking the lead on organizing the event!

FEBRUARY MEETING RECAP

Speaker

Chet Frost, Project Manager for Enstar's Homer Trunk Line Project, was the speaker at our February luncheon. Chet talked about Enstar's plan to build a 22.7 mile natural gas distribution system from Anchor Point to Homer and Kachemak City.

An 8" pipeline will be installed from Anchor Point to Homer and a 6" pipeline will be installed from Homer to Kachemak City. After installation of the Trunk Line, distribution systems will be installed in 2013 and 2014 to serve all primary streets and most secondary streets in Homer and Kachemak City.

The project required permits from multiple agencies, including USACE, DOTPF (Utility Permit), DNR (easement for underground river crossing), USFWS (Bald Eagle and Migratory Bird Protection), and City of Homer (Utility Permit).

Chet described how a couple regulatory challenges were addressed through the permitting process, such as USACE requirements that open trenching in wetlands occur only in winter and USFWS requirements that tree clearing be limited to time windows where impacts on birds would be minimized.

Chet also talked about the challenge of being aware of property obstructions (septic, water, and stormwater systems; chicken coops/boats/auto collections) when designing the project, and emphasized Enstar's commitment to safety as it implements its construction projects.

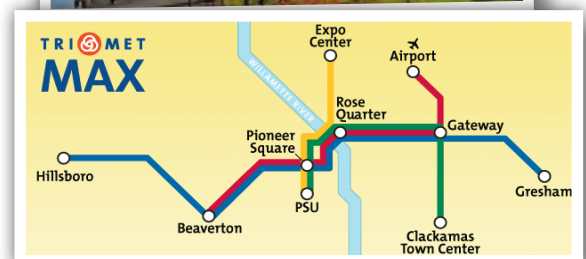
